Recharter Training

A more detailed, nuts and bolts session for <u>unit recharter coordinators</u> (sometimes called unit registrars or unit recharter executioners) will be held on **October 18** at a location to be determined. All leaders are welcome to attend both sessions, although advance sign up is requested for the October 18 session.



Welcome to FSK District

Twelve years ago, projecting rapid growth in the Southern part of Frederick County, the National Capital Area Council split the Francis Scott Key District into the Catoctin Mountain District to the North and the Appalachian Trail District to the South. Scouting flourished in our county for many years but even as the county experienced the expected growth in

population, neither District experienced a commensurate growth in membership. And along that time we faced numerous challenges, among them changes in the BSA membership policy lifting the proscription on LGBT youth and adults, changes in FCPS policies making it more difficult to market Scouting to our target audience, and general declines in membership number each year.

This past July, informed of the implications of the Fair Labor Standards Act on BSA professionals, leaders of Appalachian Trail and Catoctin Mountain Districts met to discuss joining the two Districts after many years of working together and a few abortive attempts to merge in the past.

We have decided not to discard the 65 year legacy of the Francis Scott Key District which existed prior to the split. Even so we are a new thing. We are 85 units: Packs, Troops, Crews, and Posts. We are over 1800 youth. We are over 300 volunteer adults. We host the nation's only all-volunteer-run BSA resident camp. We have held camporees, day camps, a first aid meet, and many other "joint" events that will become our District events.

I'm hopeful that our period of adjustment to the new order will be short and that as a united Frederick County we will be able to accomplish what the two separate districts could not. On behalf of your "key 5" (Nick Maliszewskyj – District Chair, Ron Layman – Deputy District Chair, Bill Desmond – District Commissioner, Melissa Udbinac – Deputy District Commissioner, and Jon Miller – District Executive), I welcome you to the new Francis Scott Key District.
