ESRA Verification

1. Your Unit Eagle Advisor must review your ESRA and related documents (including your Eagle Project Workbook) for completeness and accuracy.
2. Any errors or discrepancies must be corrected.
3. Then the ESRA, your advancement report and other Eagle Package documents are submitted to the District Eagle Representative (DER).
4. Following DER approval and receipt of reference letters, your Eagle Board of Review may be scheduled.





Requirement 7

Eagle Scout Board of Review

“Successfully complete an Eagle Scout Board of Review.”

Two objectives:

- Review the depth and breadth of the candidate’s experience as a Scout.**
- Decide whether all Eagle requirements have been satisfied.**





Eagle Board of Review

- The Eagle Board of Review (EBOR) may occur after your 18th birthday.
- Usually about 30 to 45 minutes.
- Wear your full class A uniform and bring your Eagle Package.
- Be prepared to describe:
 - Your Eagle Project - Planning, Leadership and Execution.
 - Your experiences as a Scout and personal aspirations.





Adverse Decisions

If the Eagle Board is not certain that all Eagle requirements have been met, and correction is still possible, the corrective steps will be discussed with the candidate verbally and in writing.

There is an appeal process when a Scout is not satisfied with the decision of the Eagle Board.



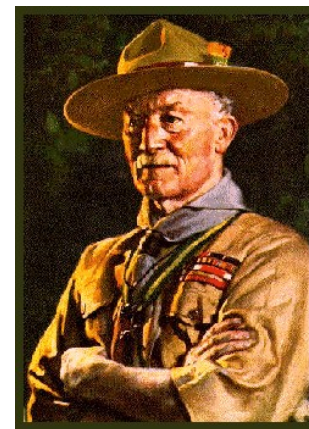


The Eagle Court of Honor
