THE PATH TO EAGLE

7 STEPS TO EARN EAGLE RANK





Step 1

Active Participation

- After earning Life Scout rank, be active in your unit for 6 months.
- Active Scouts ...
 - are registered as a Scout,
 - have not been dismissed for disciplinary reasons, and
 - Meet their unit's reasonable expectations for active participation.





Step 2

Live the values of the Scout Oath and Scout Law

Note that several adults who know you will be asked to provide character references





Step 3

Earn 21 Merit Badges

14 Required Badges



- Camping



- Citizenship in Community, Nation, Society and World



- Communications



- Cooking



- Emergency Preparedness or Lifesaving





Required Badges (continued)



- Environmental Science or Sustainability
- Family Life (minimum 90 days)
- First Aid
- Swimming, Hiking or Cycling
- Personal Management (minimum 90 days)
- Personal Fitness (minimum 90 days)

+7 Optional Merit Badges

Eagle Scout Requirement 5

While a Life Scout, plan, develop, and give leadership to others in a service project helpful to any religious institution, any school, or your community. (The project must benefit an organization other than the BSA unit.) A project proposal must be approved by the organization benefiting from the effort, your unit leader and unit committee, and the council or district before you start. You must use the Eagle Scout Service Project Worksheet, BSA 350-302, in meeting this requirement.

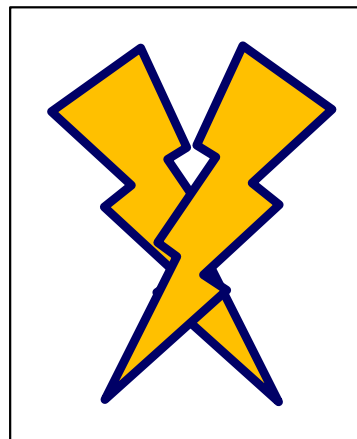

Eagle Scout requirement 5 says you must "plan" and "show" your service project. Though this final plan is a road for your use, and is not approved or signed, it is important in helping to show you have done the required planning and development. You should take the time to give your Eagle Scout board of review. Now that you are not required to provide more details than necessary for the accomplishment of your project.

A Scout who complies will illustrate the final plan, and their letter to Eagle staff and the project. He will ask a project coach to review it with him. The council or district representative who approved your proposal may have agreed to serve as your project coach, or someone else may be designated to take this important role. A project coach is important and value of your final plan is optional, but it can help you avoid many problems or mistakes. This can also improve your chances of earning the Eagle Scout Award of merit.

You should also show your final plan to your benefactor prior to carrying out your project. This will help ensure your plan aligns with the benefactor's expectations. Remember, the benefactor must give the authority to implement and approve a final project plan. Be sure to read "Managing the Eagle Scout Service Project" on the end of this worksheet.

Step 6

Participate in a Scoutmaster Conference

- **Preparation for your Eagle Board of Review.**
- **Must be done before your 18th birthday.**





Step 7

Complete your Eagle Scout Rank Application and Eagle Board of Review

- Your Eagle Application must be complete and accurate.**
- The Eagle Board will confirm that all requirements have been met.**





Step 8

Eagle Court of Honor

- Accept the “Eagle Charge” and “Eagle Scout Challenge”
- Celebrate your accomplishments!
