Welcome!

We're glad you are joining us for the 2018 Powhatan District Webelos-Ree! Webelos will be able to make progress toward advancement, watch the Flying Circus Airshow, enjoy afternoon activities, learn from REI about camping, visit Boy Scout Troops, and participate in the evening Campfire. This Guide provides important information for participants and volunteers at this year's event. First, some important information – if you read nothing else, make sure you read this section.

Date	Arrive Saturday, September 29 (Check-in begins at 9:30 a.m, Program at 10:30 a.m.) Depart Sunday September 30 after 9:00 a.m.
Place	The Flying Circus Aerodrome 5114 Ritchie Rd. (Rt. 644) Bealeton, VA 22712 The Flying Circus is roughly hour from Herndon without traffic. It is 14 miles SE of Warrenton, VA and 22 miles NW of Fredericksburg.
Who	All Webelos (fourth and fifth graders) are encouraged to attend. Webelos dens need minimum of two adults to comply with BSA youth protection standards, and should target a ratio of 1 adult per 5 scouts. Packs may combine Webelos dens to meet the minimum of two adults. All Webelos (fourth and fifth graders) are encouraged to attend. Webelos dens need minimum of two adults to comply with BSA youth protection standards, and a minimum ratio of 1 adult per 4 scouts. Packs may combine Webelos dens to meet the minimum of two adults.
Cost	\$25 per person (Scouts and adults)
Registration	Event Website Participants may register either as a Pack, Webelos Den, or individually. Individuals should register only after having confirmed plans with their Webelos Den.

Location

The Flying Circus is located in Bealeton, VA, roughly one hour from Herndon. Parking is available at the Webelos-Ree site. To ensure one-way traffic flow, all participants and volunteers should enter through the staff gate on Rt. 644 (also known as Ritchie Rd.) All participants should exit through the main gate.

Directions: From I-66 West, take exit 43 to Rt. 29 South. Go approximately 18 miles, take Rt. 17 South towards Fredericksburg. The Flying Circus is on the left after 7 miles, at Rt.644.

Powhatan District Camporee

The Webelos-Ree is being held in conjunction with the Powhatan District Camporee. Boy Scouts and Webelos will participate in several joint activities (below). Camping areas will be separated per BSA requirements (see Map, end of document).

Joint Boy Scout – Webelos Activities

Several joint activities are planned; the following times are tentative:

1. Flying Circus Airshow (12:15 p.m. Saturday)
2. Evening Flag Ceremony (5:30 p.m. Saturday)
3. Campfire Program (8:15 p.m. Saturday – Assemble at 8:00 p.m.)
4. Closing Ceremony (8:30 a.m. Sunday)

Airshow

All participants and volunteers will enjoy an airshow Saturday afternoon. The Flying Circus will perform an abbreviated version of their public airshow normally presented Sundays to the public. Airshow admission is included in the participant fee. Come watch as pilots perform acrobatics in the air in vintage biplanes.

Webelos-Ree Patrol Assignment

Program activities will be organized and assigned by a Webelos-Ree Patrol. Patrols will be assigned by the Webelos-Ree staff, and a patrol may contain a single Webelos den, multiple Webelos dens from the same Pack, or Webelos dens from different Packs.

Participants will learn their patrol assignments at registration. All Patrols will have the opportunity to participate in all Webelos-Ree activities.

Morning Program: First Responder and Scouting Adventure Pins

All Webelos will be able to earn either the First Responder Adventure or work on the Scouting Adventure pins. Training will begin at 10:30 and conclude before lunch.

Webelos should elect to pursue EITHER the First Responder pin or Scouting Adventure pin. It is recommended that new Webelos pursue the First Responder pin (as well as any fifth-grade Webelos who do not have the pin). All of the requirements for the First Responder Adventure Pin will be covered at this event.

Arrow of Light Webelos will be able to work on the Scouting Adventure Pin requirements 1, 5 and 6, which focus on learning Boy Scout terminology, ideals, requirements, knot skills and knife safety. Requirements 2 and 3 should be done with on their own. Note: Attendance at the Webelos-ree and using the patrol method while you camp counts for requirement 4.

Program: Scoutcraft Stations

After the Airshow and lunch, Webelos will participate in a variety of Scoutcraft adventures at four stations. Each station will feature a combination of learning and execution. Each group will visit the following stations, each for 40 minutes:

Station #1: Archery – Webelos will learn Archery safety and get a chance to shoot. Participation will allow the Webelos to earn the Shooting Sports Patch.

Station #2: STEM Challenge: Hydraulics – Webelos will learn about and build hydraulic parts.

Station #3: I9 Sports Flag Football – What adventure is more central to having fun in Scouting than learning a new sport? This station will offer Webelos the challenge of learning Flag Football and give them time to try their hand at it. Keep this in mind if you are working on the Stronger, Faster, Higher Adventure.

Station #4: Firebuilding - Patrols will compete against each other in a firebuilding contest.

Patrols will rotate between four scoutcraft stations in the afternoon, according to the following schedule:

REI Booth and Class

REI will be exhibiting at the Camporee between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., and will offer a class on the Ten Essentials of Camping at 4:30 p.m.

Webelos Visits to Troops

At 7:15 p.m., Webelos may visit Boy Scout Troops to learn more about individual Boy Scout Troops. Troops will host Webelos in their campsites. Please note it will be dark at roughly 7:15 p.m. that evening; Webelos should bring a flashlight.

Campfire

We will assemble for a joint Camporee/Webelos-Ree Campfire at 8 p.m. Saturday evening. All Webelos dens (Pack dens, not temporary Webelos-Ree Patrols) are encouraged to participate in the Campfire by performing a skit or song. All skits or songs must be pre-approved by the Campfire Master of Ceremonies before 7:00 PM Saturday. The Campfire Master of Ceremonies will be available beginning during lunch and throughout the day for consultation.

Meals

Saturday Lunch	Participants should bring a bag lunch for Saturday. Participants will eat lunch outdoors in the Air Show seating area (benches).
Saturday Dinner	Participants will enjoy a hot pasta dinner prepared by the Order of the Arrow chapter. All paper products (plates, cups, napkins, silverware) will be provided.
Sunday Breakfast	Participants will enjoy breakfast Sunday morning before departure, again prepared by the Order of the Arrow.
Special Dietary Considerations	Vegetarian and gluten-free options will be available. So that the Webelos-Ree Committee can get an approximate count of special meals required, please e-mail the Webelos-Ree Committee and advise if a special meal is required, or of other dietary restrictions.
Water	Water will be available at the Webelos-Ree site. Participants should bring a water bottle to the event.

Site Camping Rules

We will be guests of The Flying Circus, and as all good guests do, we should follow all posted rules and regulations as well as guidance offered by the Camporee Co-Chairs. Pertinent rules include:

Campsite Access & Amenities	<p>Webelos-Ree campsites will be located south of the main entrance road (Camporee campsites will be on the north side of the road). Because Webelos will be bringing limited camping equipment, Webelos vehicles should proceed to the parking area and transport gear to the campsite.</p> <p>Campsites will be grassy and could include some low spots. Campsites will be assigned to Webelos dens or Packs at check-in.</p> <p>Important: Campsites will not include any picnic tables or fire pits.</p>
Fires	<p>The Flying Circus prohibits fires in the camping area. A joint Camporee-Webelos-Ree Campfire is scheduled for Saturday evening.</p>
Hangar and Building Access	<p>Participants are not allowed in aircraft hangars.</p>
Restrooms	<p>Participants may use the Flying Circus restrooms (men's and women's) located near the airshow seating area. Participants may also use the port-a-johns located near camping area.</p> <p>No dishwashing is allowed in the restrooms.</p>
Water	<p>Drinking water is available at several spigots at the Flying Circus site:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• North side of road near ticket booth• Snack bar• Restrooms
Trash	<p>Trash should be bagged and deposited in (not around, or on top of) the Flying Circus dumpster located near the campfire area. Participants should refrain from depositing bags of trash in the Flying Circus public trash cans, as staff will need to quickly prepare the grounds for a public airshow shortly after our departure Sunday morning.</p>
Other Rules	<p>Typical BSA rules apply to the Webelos-Ree, including:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1) Adult leaders will be responsible for the behavior of their Webelos.2) No alcoholic beverages are permitted.3) No firearms, BB guns, slingshots, or bows and arrows are permitted.4) No fireworks are permitted.

First Aid and Emergencies

Each participant should bring a BSA Medical Form (Parts A and B – no doctor signature required.) Webelos leaders will maintain possession of these forms throughout the event.

Powhatan District Health and Safety volunteers will staff a First Aid station at the Pavilion. Participants requiring first aid should report to the First Aid station with their medical form in hand (Webelos should be accompanied by an adult).

In emergency situations, an adult participant should call 911 immediately and send a runner to the First Aid station to notify the Health and Safety team.

If the Health and Safety team determines that additional medical treatment or assessment is required, they may call 911. The nearest hospital is Fauquier Hospital, 500 Hospital Dr Warrenton, VA 20186. Their phone number is 540-316-5000.

This hospital provides 24-hour Emergency Care including advanced life support. To get there, program your GPS and/or use the following directions: Take JAMES MADISON HWY / US-15 N / US-17 N / US-29 N toward WARRENTON / WASHINGTON. Turn LEFT onto US-17 / US-29 BR. Turn LEFT onto CARRIAGE HOUSE LN. Turn RIGHT onto VETERANS DR. Turn LEFT onto HOSPITAL DR.

Check-In and Check-Out

One adult representing each den should report to the Pavilion for Check-In between 9:30 and 10:30 a.m. Saturday morning. At Check-In, a volunteer will provide campsite information to the den, and the den should then proceed to the campsite to set up camp. Webelos will also have an opportunity before dinner to set up camp; Webelos should be ready to begin the morning program at 10:30 a.m.

If a Webelos Den is not planning to spend the night, they should plan on arriving between 10:00 and 10:30, park, and send a single adult representative to Check-In.

On Sunday, Packs should send a single representative to the Headquarters for Check-Out.

Webelos-Ree patches will be distributed to the adult checking in each den.

Adult Volunteers

We still need some adult volunteers to assist in executing the Webelos-Ree. Please e-mail the [Webelos-Ree Committee](#) and advise if you can assist with Check-In or Saturday afternoon. Packs may be asked to supply an adult volunteer from their Pack if volunteers are still needed the week before the event.
